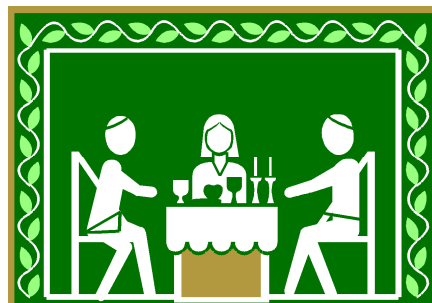

During the morning Torah service, the festivities continue, with more dancing and singing with the Torahs. And we keep reading until everyone gets an aliyah (called up to the Torah).

***Tashlikh* Ceremony -- Rosh HaShanah**

Tashlikh, which means “to throw” in Hebrew, is the ceremony which includes the throwing of bread crumbs into a body of water. This ceremony demonstrates that we have the power to separate sinful behavior from our lives. We symbolically cast into the water the wrongs we have done to ourselves and others this past year and reaffirm our commitment to do better this New Year.

At the *Tashlikh* service, we read traditional verses appropriate for the day, including the famous words of the prophet Micah (7:19):

"He will take us back in love; He will cover up our iniquities.
You will cast all their sins into the depths of the sea."

Please join us immediately after services on the first day of Rosh Hashanah for *Tashlikh* service in our “wetlands” behind the Temple and bring some “sins” to throw into the water.

Selichot Services

Selichot, a Hebrew word for “forgiveness,” is the name of the service on the Saturday night prior to Rosh Hashanah. Traditionally, it is thought that the evening is a particularly powerful time to ask for forgiveness. We come with our fear of a dark and uncertain world carrying with us all of our “baggage” from the past year. We hope that through our contrition we will enter the new year with a renewal of both spirit and heart. In the words of the Psalmist, “Weeping may last for the night, but joy comes with the dawn.”

During our Selichot program, we gather for study, some refreshments and the Selichot service. We also dedicate the memorial plaques in memory of beloved family and friends. This is truly a unique and moving experience. Please join us this year on Saturday night, September 4 starting at 8:30 p.m.
